We feel truly blessed by God in being able to serve and know our family at St. Paul. May God bless you all!





THURSDAY BIBLE STUDY

We took off for the month of December so we could enjoy and celebrate Christmas. Now that we have begun a new year, it's time to fire up our Thursday Bible Study classes. Every Thursday, or just about, we have three class time of the same lesson material offered at 8:00 and 10:00AM with plenty of coffee and an evening class at 6:30PM. The classes meet in Fellowship Hall. You are invited to join in and be a part of a fellowship of St. Paul disciples growing in their understanding of God's will for us.

To help enrich our Spiritual campaign, we're going to dive into the **CORE BELIEFS** that define us as Lutherans and as Christians. Since we are at war with the evil, it might be a good idea for us to armed with a clear understanding of what we believe and why so we can respond when challenged. Note: we will be challenged, especially if we are serious about reaching out beyond ourselves to the communities that surround us with their untold numbers of unchurched people.

There are three questions we need to be able to answer: What are we? What do we believe? How can we tell someone else? We now live in a pluralistic, multi-cultural, and obviously post-denominational world. More and more people don't want the religious "professional" to be the one to tell them what they should believe.

Personally, I believe that the "professional model" (or "my guys" as I have referred to them) which has been the stable for the church over many generations has damaged the witness of the church. This idea that "You'll need to ask the pastor about that" never was a good approach. It is time for each Christian to be able to tell another what they believe and to be able to answer the questions why.

God calls us to reach out to others and share our faith — not just the pastors.

Well, we're going to take a straightforward look at the core of what we believe from a biblical, theological, historical, and confessional point of view. The topics we will study are:

God	Holy Spirit	Last Things	Sacraments
Jesus	The Church	The Bible	
Sin	Salvation	Christian Life	

These are the basics. When we're done, as Lent begins, we'll have a handle on what we believe and why.

I hope you'll make the commitment to join us at one of our Thursday classes as a support to our small group spiritual campaign or just to do a little personal growing. We'll be glad to have you come and join in.

It's a time that we should be proud of and shine our light for all to see as we tell the story of the One we believe in.

The days and evening were a great time for fellowship and being servants of the Lord and working together to accomplish a task of spreading the news that Jesus' life is important to us and that **Jesus is the True Reason for the Season**.

How Will You Be Remembered?



On September 20, my world was rocked with news that my mom had stage III-IV pancreatic cancer. While the doctor said her life could be extended through chemotherapy, her cancer was inoperable and likely terminal. Over the past three months, Mom has suffered through chemo with incredible grace. Even though the cancer and its treatment has taken so much from her, we are so grateful for the getting to spend some quality time with Mom since her diagnosis. However, the end of her life on this earth is very much on our minds.

During one of my recent visits, Mom asked if I would be willing to have a role in her memorial service. Suddenly my mind began to race as I thought about what to say about the woman who gave me birth; who changed my diapers and bandaged my wounds; who counseled me and coached me; who taught me about Jesus and living life with purpose; who always stood behind

me as I grew to be a husband, father, and pastor.

And then it struck me – check that – God smacked me in the noggin with the truth about Mom from His Word: "We love because he first loved us." (1 John 4:19) As I reflected on my mom's life, I realized that this verse is how she will be remembered. Through all of her life as a daughter, sister, wife, mother, grandmother, aunt, friend, co-worker, deaf educator, artisan, school volunteer, 4-H leader, refugee resettlement volunteer coordinator, MOPS mentor, and in countless other roles, Mom loved others with Jesus' love because Jesus' love for her had conquered her life in its entirety. The life she has lived she lived no longer for herself, but for Him! And all who have the privilege of knowing Glennis Paulson Formwalt can testify to this truth!

Now Mom would be the first to admit she is far from perfect and that she, too, is a sinner in need of God's mercy and grace in Christ Jesus. But she lives with confidence in the face of death that through Jesus' death and resurrection she will inherit eternal life as a child of God. And in every way throughout her life to this day, she simply wants everyone to know that she loves them because Jesus loves them, too.

So what are you living for? How will you be remembered? These are questions that I've begun to ask myself as I reflect on Mom's life and legacy. God has gifted each one of us with just one life to live here on earth, so let's use it for the sake of the Kingdom of God, remembering that "We love because he first loved us."


The Adult Christian Education (ACE) Schedule for January 2019

Three Days of Prayer - January 1-3 2019

For the last seven years the LCMC churches have come together into three days of prayers with our brothers and sisters in Christ across the country. We are a church body which is strongly rooted in the truth of God's Word and in the belief that God is fully alive and calling us to follow Him. Prayer is a way we can ALL come together to express our greatest joys or our deepest heartaches before the throne of God. Take the time each day to pray for our church, our community, and our world. It is said that the church will never rise-up, until we first get down on our knees!

DAY ONE: CONFESSION This is a day focused on **confession.** We have made our lives, our relationships-and even the church-in our own image. We confess that the church belongs to Jesus and not to us.

Read and pray: Psalm 51 – David's confession for his sins; it is a great model for us to lay down our pride, and our agenda and ask the Lord for forgiveness.

"Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion; blot out my transgression, wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin." Verse 1

DAY TWO: PETITION This is a day focused on prayers for our congregations, for the pastor, for the leaders who carry out all ministries and for our missionaries in foreign lands. Pray for those in hospital and nursing homes and for all connected to your church that they might know God's redeeming love.

Read and pray: 1 Timothy 2: 1-4 Paul's request to Timothy to pray for all who are in authority.

"I urge, then, first of all, that requests, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for everyone – for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness." Verses 1&2

DAY THREE: VISION Pray the Holy Spirit will again move through the hearts and minds of leaders and pastors for God's vision for His church to be revealed and fulfilled. This is the time for prayers of revival.

Read and pray: John's words in Revelation 4:1; and 22: 1-8; 22-26

"He said to me: 'It is done. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End...'" Revelation 22:6


SUNDAY SCHOOL

law school, so he sat on a bench outside the Dean's office for seven days until they finally let him enroll.




